[The Centre d'Économie de la Sorbonne](#) (CES, Sorbonne Economics Centre) at the Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne (France) invites applications for a tenure-track position as Junior Professor Chair (5 years). Towards the end of the period, the candidate will be evaluated for a tenured position as a Full Professor according to national and internal guidelines and requirements.

The **Chair in Data Science for Sustainable Development** will produce economic research on the major challenges of sustainable development through the mobilization of new data (e.g. geographical, historical, textual, financial, etc.), which may require the use of artificial intelligence methods such as machine learning or deep learning. The person recruited will be able to work on themes such as development, environment and climate change, poverty and inequality, urban economics, political economy, trade, or labor market and demography.

The person recruited will contribute actively to the scientific life of the Chair and participate to the recruitment of a post-doc in data science.

Applicants should have completed a doctorate, preferably in economics. Doctors in data science or computer science with applications in economics may also apply. Candidates will ideally have between 2 and 4 years of post-doctoral or assistant professor experience.

The successful candidate should have a demonstrated ability to publish research at a high international level. Collaborative skills as well as teaching experience will be taken into consideration. The teaching load is competitive (64 hours per year). Courses can be taught at the undergraduate, master and doctoral levels of the Sorbonne School of Economics.



The person recruited will be hosted at the Centre d'Economie de la Sorbonne.

Selected candidates will be invited for a seminar in May 2023 and interviewed by a hiring committee in June 2023.
